White Man's Numbers Sunil Shah Ciaran Blackwell Publishing Review: Brian Joss

If you thought that the money men of this world – analysts, bankers and chartered accountants – always wore grey suits and led boring, grey lives, then Sunil Shah's thriller set in the world of fund management will quickly disabuse you of that notion. Ravi Dharma, an Indian who grew up in Kenya, is a financial analyst who works for Pluto Asset Management (PAM) in Cheapside, London, and is sent to Cape Town to open an office, "because it is the gateway to the corporate world in South

Sent with him are his boss, Christopher; star analyst Margaret, a femme fatale; and Jacob Khumalo, an Oxford graduate whose father Themba is well connected to the South African government.

In Cape Town, Ravi seems to have the Midas touch, as everything he deals in turns to gold. Well almost. He discovers companies with undervalued properties,

dotcom entrepreneurs and e-wallets that will transform banking as we know it.

Ravi is riding the crest of a wave and to make his life even more blissful, he's in love with human rights lawyer Anjali who has forsaken her Indian roots and traditions to follow him to the Mother City.

However, things are not what they seem. Behind the glittering facade of PAM's office there is back-stabbing, corruption, treachery and the liberal use of lines of cocaine, all conspiring to bring Ravi down with a crash. The scene-setter in which Ravi finds himself in jail gives no clue to the machinations that follow in this gripping financial thriller nor any hint of the unexpected and explosive climax.

All the characters are well fleshed out from the unemotional Christopher, who can distance himself from the markets, to Margaret, who uses her feminine wiles to seduce clients into playing the money game. Then there's Scarface, a member of the notorious 28s, who saves Ravi's life in
